#### FIRE PREVENTION MONTH ASSEMBLIES - TOMORROW (10/18/22) SECOND NOTICE

October is Fire Prevention Month. Parents may recall leaders from our Hamden Fire Department (HFD) visiting elementary schools to raise fire safety awareness in previous years. We are proud to now offer our middle school students an opportunity to learn about fire prevention. Their message is important to ensure your homes and families are protected.

On Tuesday, October 18th, all middle school students will attend an assembly in the auditorium. Representatives from the HFD will share information regarding the real impact of house fires - not the dramatic scenes one can see on a television program! Students will learn how important it is to quickly notice signs of a problem and to immediately act. House fires can start in the kitchen, and the firefighters will share tips to avoid larger problems. (Never throw water on a grease fire!) Students will also learn how to safely charge their electronic devices. Several house fires started as a result of cell phones and laptops being charged in a bed. Students will also be reminded to always check fire alarms to be sure they are properly working.

The information presented in this assembly will be extremely helpful. We want parents to let us know if their children may be sensitive due to previous experiences or fears of fire. We can accommodate students who may need to talk to a school counselor or potentially miss the assembly. #### WINTER SPORTS REGISTRATION BOYS AND GIRLS BASKETBALL

Attention student athletes and families who are interested in trying out for the HMS basketball teams: It is time to register!

Step 1: Please visit this <u>website</u> to sign your child up to try out. All families must use <u>Final Forms</u> to register.

Step 2: As part of the registration process, families must submit a current **Health Assessment Form** prior to trying-out for any sport. Physicals are valid for 13 months. If you have any questions regarding the Health Assessment Form, please contact our school nurses at (203)407-7192. Step 3: Maintain passing grades. We want our student athletes to demonstrate excellence in the classroom by earning passing grades. If a student is failing two or more classes, he/she will not be eligible to try out for the team.

We understand our parents may need to pick up their children early from school at times. We get it: doctors and dentists appointments can often only be scheduled during the day. ### **SPECIAL EDUCATION and 504 SOFTWARE CHANGE**

On July 1, 2022, the Connecticut State
Department of Education (CSDE) required each
town in the state to transition to a new software
program, Connecticut Special Education Data
System (CT-SEDS), which would accommodate all
new Individualized Education Plans and 504
Plans moving forward. Training opportunities
were provided for staff at the middle to end of last
school year and have continued this summer and
fall. As with any new software, there are many
glitches in the CT-SEDS program, but the CSDE
and the software company are working to address
them as quickly as possible.

We will be using a combination of IEP/504 Direct, the older software program, and CT-SEDS, the new software program, this year. If you have a meeting to review and revise your child's IEP/504, for example, we will use IEP/504 Direct. If there is an annual meeting or your child is new to Special Education or to 504, we must use CT-SEDS. Hamden pupil personnel service staff has been working hard to adjust to and learn this program. They are quickly becoming proficient, but the many problems with the software have prevented timely finalizations to IEPs and 504s. Rest assured that we are working closely with the CSDE, and they are working as quickly as possible to resolve the problems that all staff around the state are encountering.

It is important to understand that special education and 504 programming is NOT changing! We are using different software only. Please contact me or Michael McDermott at the Central Office with any questions. I am also hoping to get to a SEPTA Meeting soon to discuss this change in software with you directly.
