Kevin Keating recommended we need to revisit teaching strategies, a system that could build through the years of middle and high school so that students are prepared for post-secondary. It would be a system all teachers would use for effectiveness and would start off in fifth and sixth grade and build throughout the years of middle and high school focusing on higher order thinking skills with a heavy emphasis on reading comprehension. There should be evidence of this being used in all classes no matter what the discipline is.
School Spirit recommended. Ms. DeCosta gave an update on the upcoming safety week that students will be participating in and spirit activities such as "Hello Week" where cheerleaders and jazz band playing when students enter school in mornings. A discussion on how to continue with school spirit, leading to more positive school energy, leading to better school attitudes and behaviors, etc. and connectedness to the school to encourage students to engage with each other.
