


... and to all of the students recognized at the Principals List Bagel Breakfast in January. There will be one more Breakfast in the spring!

5th Grade Trout

Earlier this school year the fifth grade received trout eggs. We learned that we had to take out the eggs that grew mold on them, because the eggs that grew mold on them wouldn't hatch. When we received the trout they hadn't hatched yet so we didn't have to feed

they hadn't hatched yet so we didn't have to feed them. They could feed on their own egg shells. When the trout eggs hatched we started giving them food every day. We also have to make sure the temperature of the water in the tank is accurate. The tank has to be a specific temperature in order for the trout to survive. At the end of the year we are planning to go to Sleeping Giant State Park to release them into a stream.
