WEARING A MASK: IT IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY TO OUR COMMUNITY

As we prepare for the first day of school, <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>September 15, 2020</u>, **we ask all students who are participating in the Hybrid Learning model to find a comfortable face mask to wear to school**. Students are encouraged to also pack a spare face mask in their backpacks. All members of the school community will wear face masks each day in school.

Following CDC recommendations, students must wear a face mask that covers their nose and mouth, and it must wrap under their chin. **Bandanas, face gaiters, and masks with exhalation valves and vents are not acceptable**. Masks may be homemade, purchased cloth, or disposable face coverings. A multi-ply tightly woven cotton cloth or multi-ply disposable face covering is recommended. If a student arrives at school without a mask, we will provide him or her with a disposable mask to wear.

The recent trend is to find a mask that represents one's interests. When considering masks appropropriate for school, please understand we do not want a mask to interfere or distract the learning process. Student masks may not advertise or display the symbols of drugs, tobacco products, or alcoholic beverages. Masks should not be racially insensitive or display or imply profane or obscene language or symbols. Finally, masks should not include emblems, insignias, badges, tattoos, gang-related or other symbols where the effect thereof is to unreasonably attract the attention of other students or cause disruption or interference with the operation of the school. Parents should review and approve all masks selected for students.

There will be a few mask breaks throughout the school day. Weather permitting, students will have an opportunity to go outdoors each day for a quick break. They can remove their masks while eating lunch. They can also remove their masks during a bathroom break. At times, students will be permitted to remove their masks during physical education class. We understand the importance of wearing a mask, and we are prepared to support our students with this new requirement.

As a faculty and staff, we are kicking off the year with a special campaign. "I wear my mask for..." We are all committed to wearing our face masks, and we do so for many reasons. Check out these pictures of our teachers.

LEARNING FROM HOME

Students will be working from home in both learning models, Hybrid Learning and Distance Learning. It is important to find a quiet, positive work setting. Consider these recommendations:

- Locate a space away from siblings and family pets.
- Set up a clean table or desk near an electrical outlet.
- Be sure there is proper lighting.
- Get headphones or earbuds.
- Organize school supplies in the location.
- Select a neutral background for "zooming" into class, such as a plain wall.

Getting ready for the first day of school is important. We need to embrace a positive mindset and get organized.

HYBRID LEARNING MODEL CALENDAR - SEPTEMBER 2020

It will be important for families to manage the Hybrid Learning model. As a reminder, students with a last name beginning with A through K are assigned to Group 1. They should report to school on Mondays and Tuesdays, as well as every other Friday. Students with a last name beginning with L through Z are assigned

to Group 2. They should report to school on Wednesdays and Thursdays, as well as every other Friday. The following chart outlines the plan for the first three weeks of school. As a reminder, students must continue to participate in learning when they are home. Students will follow their schedules and log into Google Classroom to connect with their teachers and classmates.

Middle School Athletics Update

At this time, we are pleased to announce our plans to offer a fall sports program at HMS. There are three fall teams, including:

- o Boys Soccer Team coached by Mr. Jay Cebula;
- o Girls Soccer Team coached by Ms. Nora Crann; and
- Girls Volleyball Team coached by Mr. Jimmy Poulsen.

HMS will follow guidance from the DPH and the CIAC. All teams will practice outdoors, and coaches will focus on skill based training. Teams will not compete against other schools, and there will be no games in our conference.

The program will be offered four days of the week, Monday through Thursday. Students will follow the Hybrid Learning model. Students who are participating in Distance Learning are eligible to participate, but must follow the schedule below:

Our after-school program will begin at 3:00 p.m. and conclude at 4:45 p.m. Student athletes will go home after school and then return to school at 3:00 p.m. Students must dress appropriately for practice and bring a personal water bottle. Please note student athletes will not have access to the locker rooms facilities, and coaches are unable to provide water. It will be essential for student athletes to return to practice with the required items.

Parents who are interested in their child playing a fall sport, must complete the online registration using the link below for FamilyID. An email account is required to create an account on FamilyID. Once you complete the registration, the school nurse will review the necessary medical forms and HMS coaches will check for academic eligibility.
