We are committed to teaching our students expectations to promote school safety and successful behaviors. Last week, we focused on two goals -- reporting to class on time and wearing a face mask over our nose and mouth. We noticed a tremendous improvement, and we thank our students and families for their support. We will continue to monitor students through "late sweeps" and regular check-ins.

This week, we will focus on keeping our hands to ourselves and demonstrating control of one's body. We understand middle school students are continuing to develop impulse control, as well as skills to resolve conflicts. When students are at HMS. they can always seek out a trusted adult to help solve problems. Students often identify their teachers and school counselors as adults who can help. Many students also rely on our school climate advisors, Mr. Kim Mallard and Mr. Charles Neal, as well as our well-respected school security guard, Mr. Aaron Hawkins (AKA Coach Hawk). We will continue to build trusting relationships with our students and support them during their middle school years.



STUDENT SPOTLIGHT


