DROPPING OFF YOUR CHILD? PICKING UP YOUR CHILD? READ ON!

We are grateful to our parents who worked with us during this first week of school. We know the traffic can feel overwhelming, and we are confident that it will continue to get better. Here are some tips that might improve your experience:



1. Always pull up as far as you can go. Students can be dropped off in front of the school by the stop sign. Keep moving up as far as you can. More parent cars in our lot equals less on Dixwell Avenue!

2. MORNING: Members of the faculty and staff are getting outside as early as 7:30 a.m. Students can exit their parent's car and stand under the portico until doors open at 7:45 a.m.

3. AFTERNOON: This week, we dismissed our students a little earlier. While this extra time seems to help, we cannot permanently follow this plan. (It reduces instructional time during period 7.) Parents can come early to wait in the lot; however, students will be dismissed at 2:29 p.m.

- 4. AFTERNOON: Write your child's first and last name on a piece of paper with a dark marker and leave it in the front window of your passenger side of the car. It will help staff find your child and encourage them to get to the car as soon as possible.
- 5. If your child exits the car on Dixwell Avenue, please be sure they are leaving the car on the right hand side of the vehicle. Then, the child can walk down the grass and onto the sidewalk.
- 6. Students should only cross Dixwell Avenue by the crosswalk. There is a crossing guard ready to help students safely cross the street.
- 7. If your child is a WALKER, please email Ms. Singla at <u>asingla@hamden.org</u>. We want parent permission for students to leave school and walk home or to a local establishment, like the Miller Library.

In regard to bus transportation, we will continue to serve as a liaison between our HMS families and First Student. It has been a challenge due to the bus driver shortage. HEALTH ASSESSMENT & MASKS

All parents, students, and staff should review the <u>Daily Health Assessment</u> before arriving at school to reduce the risk of COVID-19 exposure in school. It is an easy checklist! Please do not send sick children to school. If your child was in contact with a person who is positive, they should quarantine. If you are waiting for COVID test results, stay home. Our school nurses are happy to support families by providing information and answering questions. We are so happy to offer in-person learning, and we want our students with us.

In addition, students are required to wear face masks to school. We recommend that our students wear a mask and bring a spare mask in their backpack. Parents, please talk to your children about properly wearing their masks. <u>Masks</u>

should cover the nose and mouth. It should fit comfortably around the face. We need to work together to keep everyone in our community healthy.



TEAM REPORT

Our middle school is composed of teams or houses. Teaming allows for smaller cohorts of students to work together during the day, providing a way for teachers to get to know their students better and thus better meet their social/emotional and academic needs. This approach also provides the opportunity for multi-disciplinary learning - a great way to make learning more meaningful and engaging. There are eight teams; four seventh grade teams and four eighth grade teams. We will often recognize teams for their accomplishments.
