

What is Open Choice?

Open Choice is part of a law passed by the legislature of the State of Connecticut to help reduce the racial, ethnic, and economic isolation in Connecticut. It allows students from the suburbs to attend school in New Haven, where there are appropriate grade openings. ACES (Area Cooperative Educational Services) coordinates the Open Choice program in south central Connecticut, in collaboration with the CT State Dept. of Education.
