#### A MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL COOGAN

Dear Parents and Families,

Over the weekend, I received many emails from concerned parents. I appreciate your willingness to share your thoughts and ideas. I understand it is a challenging time for our community. There is a common thread... we want our schools to be safe so our children can focus on learning. It is reassuring to know we have this wish in common.

As you know, Superintendent Goeler is working in collaboration with Mayor Garrett and Police Chief Sullivan to investigate the social media threats and to plan for a safe reopening of Hamden High School. The threats are directed at the high school community, and it was determined the elementary and middle schools should open with increased police presence. We received tremendous support from our School Resource Officer, Jeremy Brewer, and other officers who patrolled the campus on Friday. I anticipate increased support throughout this week. In addition, our team of security guards and school climate specialists are a tremendous resource within our community. They know our teachers and students. They have strong connections with our students and families, and they work each day to support transitions and routines. As a result of this support, we are prepared to continue with teaching and learning at HMS.

On Friday, I addressed our student body through morning announcements. I shared the concerns at our high school, and reminded everyone how important it is to report any problems, including posts on social media. I referred to the "see something, say something" motto, and encouraged all students to report concerns to parents and adults. Ms. Tresselt, school counselor, and I also reminded students that there are many trusted adults at HMS. In addition to parents and families, students can share their concerns or worries with teachers, school counselors, social workers, psychologists, climate specialists, administrators and more. We recognize the current events create stress and worry for children. We are helping kids feel safe at HMS. We will continue to reach out to students through morning announcements, classroom visits, and informal check-ins throughout the upcoming week.

Our school district has created routines for emergency drills that we teach and practice with our students. This week, we will continue to teach students the importance of listening to adults. Our faculty and staff are trained to respond to a crisis and keep students safe. We will discuss, model, and practice the routines for a lockdown drill. It is important for parents to understand our plans. We do not want to create stress or feelings of anxiety. We believe practicing emergency drills is a strategy to demonstrate our preparedness. The lockdown drills will be clearly communicated in advance to our community. Please ask your children about the practice of emergency drills and reassure them that they are designed to ensure safety at school.

While the threats of school violence were directed toward Hamden High School, we will continue to nurture a safe school environment for all schools within our district. We appreciate the ongoing support of parents and families, as these life skills are learned at home and reinforced at school. Together, we can help our kids make positive choices for themselves and our community. Finally, I encourage all members of our community to virtually attend the Special Board of Education meeting tonight. It will be an important opportunity to learn about our district's plans for increased school safety measures. (Please refer to the image below for details.)

There is so much to celebrate at HMS. Our students are busy learning with their teachers. The National Junior Honor Society is hosting a community fundraiser to support the Toys for Tots drive. Students are playing basketball and getting ready for the Ski Club. Our aspiring actors are learning their roles for *Annie Jr.* So many children earned <u>High Honors and Honors</u> during the first marking period. I wish our weekly newsletter could focus on our students and their positive contributions to HMS. However, I understand it is important to communicate information regarding school safety at this time. Please continue to send me your thoughts through email or phone calls. Your feedback is important to me.
