Transportation and School Start Times Background

In the summer of 2022, administration proposed a change to the 4-tier bussing system which meant there would be a change to school start times.

Ultimately, there was a decision to keep the 4-tier bussing system and have the 2022-2023 school year keep the same school start times.

Transportation and School Start Times Background

Where transportation and school start times are concerned, the process has included, but is not limited to the following:

- Multiple meetings with our Core Team and Executive Leadership Team throughout the process
- Meetings with the Chief Operating and Financial Officer (COFO), Tom Ariola and regional route planners at First Student Bus Company in order to further clarify our expectations and provide them with clear parameters for bus transportation
- Meetings with the Transportation Working Group comprised of parents, teachers, principals, district administrators, a First Student Bus Company Supervisor, and the COFO
- Multiple discussions at Board meetings
- An informative all parent communication was sent on January 23, 2023 briefing parents on the discussion of school start times, as well as the Wintergreen relocation
- First Student made a formal presentation for the full board on February 14, 2023



Transportation and School Start Times Background (continued)

On October 27, 2022, administration convened a working group of various constituent groups. The purpose of the working group was to:

- Serve as a representative body for multiple constituencies so that they can communicate about transportation (which would be in addition to direct communications with such groups)
- Get a deep understanding of the nuance and challenges of our current transportation design
- Provide feedback that will inform our thinking, and ultimately inform recommendations made to the Board of Education regarding school start times for the 2023-2024 school year.



Summary of Working Group Discussions

- Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, there were 83 bus routes for the district. For the 2022-2023 school year, the number of routes was reduced to 72 due to a number of factors, including recruitment and retention of bus drivers and a 14% increase in the bus contract.
- While there was a general agreement that the 7:31 start time for Hamden High School is not the most desirable start time, there was a concern that many high schoolers need to be available to get their siblings from the bus after school
- We also have to consider that our busses have runs to do other than Hamden Public Schools, including Sacred Heart, Eli Whitney, Sound School, ECA, St. Rita's, Hamden Hall
- The proposal made in the summer of 2022 called for an hour difference in the Elementary School start times, which was problematic.
- A smaller differential in school start times (e.g. 15-20 minutes) would be reasonable for parents to adjust to.
- Elementary students don't do as well at the end of the day, so an hour later start means that they are in school an hour later than they currently are, which is especially challenging for Kindergarten and First Grade students
- Whatever the decision is has to be based upon what is best for students, and not only on what saves the district money
- No one seems to have a reasonable explanation as to why there is a 4-tier bussing system in the first place



Summary of Working Group Discussions (continued)

- Convened a second meeting of the working group on January 24, 2023
- First Student reviewed the current bussing situation and proposed changes
- A Google Doc was developed for all ideas from the working group





It is important to have on time, reliable transportation every day.

By ensuring parents are notified of this change well before it's implementation. Because late notification does not help with parents making arrangements for their children for before and after school

The district should go with the plan that allows for the later start time for the HS Research shows that HS students benefit from later start times to allow them to get more adequate sleep.

4.1 (14)

They should leave it the way it is. Parents have work schedules that are already in place around the hours of school operation now and a lot of jobs are not understanding or flexible.

Considerations

- Start high school later

Wintergreen Programs and Relocation





OVERVIEW

Why the Relocations?

- Town of Hamden sold Wintergreen to ACES last year
- Wintergreen Programs:
 - 6 Instructional Intervention Center (IICs) classrooms
 - 2 Academic Life Skills Classrooms (ALSC)
 - Hamden Collaborative Learning Center
 - High Roads middle school program
- Must vacate the building by June 30, 2023



OVERVIEW

Goals

- Desire to find permanent locations for all of these programs within our existing school buildings
- Budget constraints - leasing vs. existing school building
- Minimize impact to all programs during relocation
- Stakeholder feedback from parents and families, staff and students
- Ensure minimal transitions throughout educational career in Hamden
- Building tours to assess space, appropriate facilities, and minimizing impact of additional classrooms

| Wintergreen Relocations

- The High Roads Middle School Program will be relocated to Hamden Middle School
- Hamden Collaborative Learning Center will be relocated to Alice Peck
- Wintergreen IICs and ALSC will be relocated to other Hamden school buildings



Parent and Staff Input IIC/ ALSC Relocations

- Maintain effectiveness of programming
- Ensure curriculum for ALSC includes academic curriculum as well as life skills (looking for more of a balance of socialization and academics)
- Proximity to a neighborhood school to ensure shorter bus rides
- Incorporate sensory rooms, appropriate lighting, adequate space for support services



Parent and Staff Input IIC/ ALSC Relocations

- Ensure access to Literacy and Math Specialists for support
- Concern about reallocation of supports such as speech, OT/ PT
- Focus on finding permanent homes for programs and providing a K-6 continuum so as to minimize transitions
- Ensure access to typical peers
- Allow for siblings alternate placements if requested



Current Instructional Intervention Centers (IICs) and Academic Life Skills Classrooms (ALSC) Locations

- Current classrooms already housed within our buildings are:
 - Bear Path- 3 classrooms
 - Dunbar Hill-1 classroom and the Elementary High Roads Program
 - Helen Street- 2 classrooms
 - Ridge Hill-2 classrooms
 - West Woods- 2 classrooms
 - Wintergreen- 8 classrooms
 - Hamden Middle School- 3 classrooms
 - Hamden High School- 4 classrooms



Wintergreen Programs Relocations

Total classrooms in each building:

- **Alice Peck**- 6 HCLC Classrooms and related programming
- **Bear Path**- 3 classrooms
- **Church Street**- 2 classrooms
- **Dunbar Hill**-1 classroom and the Elementary High Roads Program

Hamden Collaborative Learning Center Parent and Staff Input

- Preserve integrity of programs currently housed at Alice Peck and HCLC
- Desire to have permanent facility for HCLC students
- Age difference between students in both programs
- Security/safety (cameras, security guard, metal detectors)
- Sufficient parking spaces
- All classroom spaces, offices, and bathrooms are appropriate for needs



Hamden Collaborative Learning Center Parent and Staff Input

- Increase elective opportunities for students in HCLC (culinary arts, STEM, Fine Arts, World Language)
- Expand HCLC and HHS hybrid programming opportunities (last two periods of the day instead of one)
- Increase opportunities for vocational experiences through community partnerships
- Continued internship opportunities
- More targeted mental health and behavioral supports for students in HCLC



Transition Planning

- All impacted staff and building leaders informed of program relocations
- Transition planning for parents and students (inclusive of building tours)
- Work with Facilities department for moving classrooms in a timely fashion
- Alice Peck Building:
 - Applying for State of CT School Security Grant for items such as metal detectors, cameras, locks, lighting, etc.
 - Finalize building usage plan
 - Minor renovations to ensure the facilities are appropriate for the intended use
