Instruction

Nondiscrimination in the Instructional Program

This school system pledges to avoid discriminatory actions and seeks to foster good human and educational relations which will help to attain:

- 1 equal right and opportunities for students and staff members in the school community.

- an appropriate learning environment for students which includes (1) adequate instructional books, supplies, materials, equipment, staffing, facilities and technology, (2) equitable allocation of resources among district schools and (3) a safe school setting.

Each student, at the times/he becomes eligible for participation, will be advised of his/her right to an equal opportunity to participate in school programs without discrimination of any kind.
